Important Plan and Guidelines Detailed Below.

It is very important that you read and implement as applicable.

If a Hurricane were to affect our area during your stay, you would be informed of the threat by the following means:

Phone/Message/Text/Email

The notices you will receive during the approach of a hurricane will be given when a "Hurricane Watch" is issued and when a "Evacuation Order" is given.

During the "Watch" phase, you will be asked to keep in close touch with your landlord by utilizing the emergency phone number provided. Because of Miami-Dade County's limited evacuation routes and public shelters, you should consider checking out and seeking shelter well inland. It is suggested that notify friends or relatives of your plans.

When a "Evacuation Order" is issued, you will be required to leave as quickly as possible. Below are the public shelters for Hurricane Evacuations. These shelters should only be use as a last resort. If time permits, you should leave the area altogether and seek shelter inland.

If you do go to a shelter, you should bring everything you need except for food. Don't forget important items such as medications and special dietary needs.

Shelters do not have cots, blankets or pillows, so be prepared to rough it. You will not be allowed to bring pets, firearms or alcohol into the shelter. Smoking is not permitted.

Watches + Warnings

Terms You Need to Know...

- Tropical Storm Watch
 - Tropical storm conditions are possible, usually within 48 hours.
- Tropical Storm Warning
- Tropical storm conditions are expected, usually within 36 hours.
- Hurricane Watch Hurricane conditions are possible, usually within 48 hours.

- Hurricane Warning
- Hurricane conditions are expected, usually within 36 hours.

Evacuation Order*

A mandatory order directing the evacuation of appropriate area(s) of Miami-Dade County deemed to be in danger.

*Evacuation orders depend on a hurricane's track and projected storm surge.

HURRICANE SEASON 2016 HELPFUL INFORMATION

- Radio and television will inform if there is a need to evacuate. Television channels 4, 5, 6, 7, 10, (23 & 51 in Spanish) as well as most radio stations will be airing special coverage.

TAKE YOUR PETS WITH YOU

Hurricane season runs June 1- November 30. Be sure to include your pets in your disaster preparedness planning.

If you're riding out the storm in the home of a family member, friend or neighbor, take your pets with you. If you can't take your pet with you, Miami-Dade County offers Pet- Friendly Evacuation Centers for residents living in qualified evacuation zones, unsafe structures or mobile homes.

About Evacuation

If a hurricane evacuation is ordered, residents are encouraged to stay with family members or friends in an inland, non-evacuation area. Evacuation Centers will also be opened, but the Centers should only be considered as a last resort. Additionally, Emergency Bus Pick-Up Sites will be activated to provide public transportation to and from designated Evacuation Centers.

If you need to evacuate, it's important to bring:

- Bedding
- Infant & child care items, such

as formula, diapers, toys, etc.

- Cash
- Personal hygiene items

- Comfort materials, such as books, magazines, etc.
- Prescription and over-the- counter medications
- Snacks
- Extra clothing
- Special items for family

members who are elderly or disabled

Evacuation Center Accessibility

All Miami-Dade County Evacuation Centers meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) criteria for emergency shelters, and include accessible entryways, service/activity areas and bathrooms. Service animals are permitted.

The Emergency & Evacuation Assistance Pro- gram (EEAP) provides evacuation support to those residents that may require specialized transportation assistance or whose medical needs prevent them from evacuating on their own. Residents who will require evacuation assistance should register for the Emergency & Evacuation Assistance Pro- gram prior to an emergency to ensure help will be given when needed. It may also be utilized post disaster to provide other assistance. Pre-registered residents will receive priority during an emergency.

This program is specifically for individuals who live

in their own homes or with their families. Residents in nursing homes or assisted living facilities are not eligible for this program as these facilities are required by law to develop an emergency plan and make arrangements for their residents to evacuate to a similar facility.

Call 311, apply online or download the application at www.miamidade.gov/ re/eeap.asp. Applications are available in English, Spanish and Creole.

Miami-Dade County also offers Pet Friendly Evacuation Centers for residents living in evacuation areas, unsafe structures or mobile homes. A family member must stay with the pet. For more information, call 311 or go online at www.miamidade.gov/ animals/disaster-preparedness.asp.

•	Leave early to avoid heavy traffic and roads that may become blocked by flood waters.
•	Consider the needs of the elderly to leave early.
•	Prepare an emergency phone list, and determine how your family will remain in contact if separated during the hurricane.
•	Select meeting places and choose an out-of-state or out-of-country friend or relative as a check-in contact to call.
•	Rehearse your hurricane plan so that everyone will remember what to do. What emergency supplies should I include in a hurricane kit? In case of an evacuation, it is a good idea to prepare a hurricane kit to take with you that includes the following:
	A first aid kit that includes prescription medications.
	 Food that will not spoil and a three to five day supply of water (one gallon per person per day is suggested), eating utensils, and a manual can opener.
	Battery-powered radio, flashlight and plenty of batteries.
	One change of clothing including shoes.
	Sanitation items, such as toilet tissue and towelettes.
	Cash, credit cards, airline tickets, passports, an extra set of car keys, and all valuables.

- Special items for infants, the elderly, or the disabled.
- An extra pair of eyeglasses.

Remember:

Your hurricane supplies should be stored in easy-to-carry containers such as coolers or backpacks.

Other preparations:

Make copies of all important documents and store them in watertight containers. Keep one set of copies with you and send an extra set to an out-of-state or out-of-country friend or relative. (Tourist Hurricane Hotline: 305 468-5900).

Cleanup Before A Storm

- Dispose of household and yard trash before a storm threatens. Miami-Dade County Solid Waste
 Management customers have three options for managing household and yard trash prior to a storm:
- Dispose of small trash items and yard waste with your twice-weekly garbage collection service. If
 you receive automated waste cart service, all waste must in the green waste cart
 and the lid must close. If you receive manual collection service, small trash items may
 be set out in bags, cans or bundles with your household garbage. Items should weigh
 no more than 50 lbs. each and bundles of trash should measure no more than 4 ft. in
 length.
- Schedule a bulky waste pickup before a storm threatens by calling 311 or visiting www.
 miamidade.gov/solidwaste/bulky-waste.asp. Remember, you must schedule your pickup rst before placing trash on the right-of-way.
- Properly pruning trees and shrubs before a hurricane approaches can reduce the debris generated
 during a storm. Proper tree pruning also increases the likelihood that a tree can
 weather a storm. Make sure to consult or hire a certified and licensed arborist prior to
 pruning trees.

Do not begin any pruning or cleanup activities or place trash on the curb during a Tropical Storm or Hurricane Watch or Warning.

Miami-Dade Alerts

Don't be the last to know when a hurricane is coming. Sign up to receive text alerts for weather advisories and other emergency events with Miami-Dade Alerts. Find out more at www.miamidade.gov/alerts.

BEFORE

A Hurricane Approaches

- Disaster kits and emergency supplies should be ready prior to hurricane season. Once a hurricane warning is declared, preparations should focus on securing your home and property.
- Protect the areas where wind can enter. Secure windows and doors, preferably with permanent, Countyapproved storm shutters if property has them available. A second option is to board up windows with 5/8" plywood. You'll need to cut the boards to have it ready for installation. Tape does NOT prevent windows from breaking. PLEASE UNDERSTAND THIS IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO IMPLEMENT. IF FOR ANY REASON YOU ARE NOT CAPABLE OF DOING SO, PLEASE COMMUNICATE WITH US AT ONCE AND WITH MUCH ADVANCE NOTICE, PLEASE UNDERSTAND AT TIME OF STORM WATCH AND/OR WARNING ONLY TRUE EMERGENCY CASES AND REASONS WILL BE CONSIDERED VALID. ALL OTHERS WILL BE CONSIDERED NEGLIGENT.

[•] Bring in lawn furniture, garbage and recycling carts and other items that are not tied down and could become airborne.

[•] If you own a boat, use double lines at a marina or consider dry-dock storage.

- Protect your electronics with surge protectors and waterproof coverings.
- Fill prescriptions of emergency medications (consult pharmacist as needed).
- Monitor the storm's progress.
- Visit www.miamidade.gov or call 311 for updates on County services. Depending on conditions, bus, rail, garbage collection and recycling service, as well as airport and seaport operations, could be affected.
- Preparedness is not expensive. Many disaster kit items such as flashlights & batteries, garbage bags, etc., may be found around your home. Find out more at www.miamidade.gov/ re/ consumer-survival-kit.asp.

DURING

A Hurricane

If a hurricane is likely in your area, you should:

- Monitor your radio or television for weather up- dates and instructions from public safety officials.
- Stay indoors, preferably in a room with few or no windows.
- Take your emergency kit and disaster supplies with you if you move from room.
- If flooding threatens your home, turn off electric- ity at the main breaker.
- Use flashlights, not candles or kerosene lamps, as your light source.
- If you lose power, turn off all major appliances.
- Avoid using the phone and do not take a bath or shower during the storm.
- Fight the temptation to go outside during the "eye of the storm." There's only a brief period of calm before hurricane force winds return.
- Keep children informed about what's happening and watch for signs of stress.
- · Keep animals in their carriers.

AFTER

A Hurricane Approaches

Many disaster-related injuries occur in the aftermath of a hurricane. Here are some steps to protect you and your family:

- Remain inside until local authorities say it is safe to go outside. If you must go outside, watch for fallen objects and downed electrical wires.
- Continue to monitor the radio or TV for advice and/or instructions from local government. Call 311 or go to www.miamidade.gov/publicworks for information on waste collection services and hurricane debris pickups.
- Inspect your home for damage, assuring that it's safe to stay there. Check for gas leaks, if applicable.
- Stay out of affected areas; do not sightsee.
- Obey all curfew and emergency orders when issued.
- Stay away from downed power lines and report them to FPL.
- Do not operate charcoal grills, propane camping stoves or generators indoors. For more tips on generator safety, go to www.miamidade.gov/ re/ safety-generators.asp.
- •Do not drive or walk through standing water. It may be much deeper than you realize and there may be hidden hazards.
- •Place piles of debris on the right-of-way and away from fences, mailboxes, drains, power lines and low-hanging wires. Do not place debris in vacant lots or in front of commercial properties, nurseries or farmland.
- If you live in an area where residential and commercial uses, particularly plant nurseries, are located, do not commingle commercial and residential debris in a single pile; keep them separate.
- If you live on a property that is not adjacent to a public road right-of-way or in a gated community, do not move debris to the nearest right-of-way until instructed to do so by the County.

· Contact your insurance agent. Take pictures of damage. Keep good records of repair and cleaning costs.

Renter's Insurance Disclosure

We advise all Tenants to obtain renter's insurance for their personal property, personal injuries occurring in the Premises, and/or other damages that may occur. According to the terms of your lease, Manager/Owner is in no way responsible for damage to Tenant's personal property, and our insurance does not cover the personal property and belongings of Tenants.

Renter's insurance provides you with coverage for loss, damage, or destruction of your property.

It may also provide coverage for additional living expenses you may incur if your Premises becomes uninhabitable. Such insurance can also protect you from any liability claims resulting from your own activities. For example, if your negligence causes a fire, you may be held responsible for the damage of the property of others, including Owner's property. Similarly, if a guest were to have an accident in your apartment, you could be personally responsible for the guest's injuries.

We strongly encourage all Tenants to purchase this inexpensive form of protection. Consult with an insurance agent to review your personal needs.

REMEMBER:

The key to survival is planning. Formulate your plan of action now. Having a plan is vital.

The National Weather Service has increased their lead times for Hurricane Watches and Warnings. Watches will now be issued 48 hours in advance and Warnings will now be issued 36 hours in advance.

Emergency Evacuation Bus Pick-Up sites

For those individuals who do not have their own transportation to the Evacuation Centers, this is provided by Miami-Dade via emergency evacuation bus pick-up sites throughout the County's evacuation zones.

Miami-Dade Bus Pick-Up sites will be activated only for hurricane evacuations. Residents should listen to the media or call 311 to find out when the

buses will transport people from the pick-up sites to Red Cross Evacuation Centers. Buses that will transport people for hurricane evacuations will have a special notice on the front of the bus where the route information is displayed.

2016 HURRICANE SEASON – EMERGENCY EVACUATION PICK-UP SITES

Miami-Dade County encourages individuals living in storm surge planning zones and mobile homes to have arrangements in place to stay outside of the areas called for evacuations during a tropical storm or hurricane.

For those unable to make such arrangements, the American Red Cross opens Evacuation Centers as shelters of last resort. Individuals that are unable to provide their own transportation to an Evacuation Center can use public evacuation transportation.

Miami-Dade Transit will activate specific Emergency Evacuation Bus Pick-Up Sites by zone (zones are listed on pages 2-4) as directed by the Miami-Dade Office of Emergency Management. In addition to the zones, mobile home parks are vulnerable to high winds and have designated Evacuation Bus Pick-Up Sites (listed on pages 5-6). If a designated Emergency Evacuation Bus Pick-Up site is not located near you, regular Miami-Dade Transit bus service will continue and residents can utilize regular routes to get to an evacuation bus pick-up site. Evacuees should advise the bus operator of their intention to go to an emergency evacuation pick-up site. Residents can use the trip planner at: http://www.miamidade.gov/transit/metrobus.asp.

Emergency Evacuation Bus Pick-Up Sites are identified by a sign that reads "EMERGENCY EVACUATION BUS PICK-UP SITE." The buses placed into service for the evacuation will have displays that read "EMERGENCY EVACUATION" and these buses will only travel between Emergency

Evacuation Bus Pick-Up Sites and Evacuation Centers. Please note that the evacuation areas will be determined individually for each storm.

To learn which Emergency Evacuation Bus Pick-Up Sites are active during a particular storm you should listen to the local media, monitor the County's website at http://miamidade.gov/, or contact Miami-Dade 3-1-1.


2016 EVACUATION CENTERS

Please monitor the local radio or television, or dial 3-1-1 (TDD (305) 468-5402) to find out which centers are open when an evacuation order is announced. People who require special assistance in evacuating can dial 3-1-1 to get information about specialized evacuation centers.
